REFUND SCHEDULES

Amount of refund is to be determined in accordance with the following regulations:

In full:

1. If the University cancels the course.
2. If the University does not permit the student to enroll or continue.
3. If the student is deceased before or during the term or is drafted into military service by the United States or if the student enlisted in the National Guard or Reserves prior to the beginning of the term in which he is called to active duty and presents notice of induction or order to active duty. (A student who enlists for active duty, see "In part.")

In part:

Refunds are based on class length.

If the student requests withdrawal:

Day 8-14	70% refund
Day 15-21	50% refund
Day 22-28	30% refund
Day 29-35	20% refund
Day 36 or after greater than 31.531%	0%

Days are measured in actual days, NOT business days. All refund calculations are determined by class length percentage, not by class meetings attended or class meetings percentage. Class length is defined as the number of days between and including the beginning and ending dates of any given term/session (including weekend days and holidays).

Refunds will be determined as of the date of formal withdrawal unless proof is submitted that circumstances beyond control of the student, e.g., hospital confinement, prevented the filing of the official withdrawal earlier, in which case the refund will be determined as of the date of said circumstance. The student assumes responsibility for filing for a refund.

Refunds will be mailed as soon as possible. Refund checks are subject to deduction for any amount owed to The University of Akron by the student.

No refund will be granted to a student dismissed or suspended for disciplinary reasons.

REGISTRATION & PAYMENT INFORMATION

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Students currently enrolled at Wayne College will be able to enroll in summer classes beginning February 25. All registration must be done in person in the Student Services Office. Online registration is not available for this early registration period. This registration is for Wayne classes only! Students needing assistance in class selections or who are required to see an academic adviser can make appointments through the Student Services Office. This will not change your date of eligibility to register on the Web to add Akron classes or to change your schedule.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Tuition and fees are due by the due date whether or not a bill has been received. If students have questions about their accounts, they may contact the Office of Student Accounts and Financial Aid at 1-800-221-8308, ext. 8935, or view their student accounts online through ZipLine, where students can find the most up-to-date information on due dates and amounts due.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Cash, check, money order or credit card payments (VISA, MasterCard, or Discover).
- On the Web with credit card or e-checks at www.wayne.uakron.edu and click on ZipLine.
- Financial aid money applied to your account.
- Installment Payment Plan (IPP) contract signed and submitted with the required down payment prior to the invoice due date. A \$30 nonrefundable application fee will be billed with your first installment. The plan is designed to spread charges over the semester by dividing your balance into three or four payments billed monthly, with a \$25 late fee assessed to any late payments. Past due obligations must be paid prior to participation in this plan. Your processed financial aid will be used to reduce the balance of your account before payments are calculated.

ENROLLMENT CANCELLATION FOR NONPAYMENT

Students whose financial accounts show an amount due after their assigned due date risk having all or part of their registration for current and/or future terms cancelled; however, nonpayment of fees does not guarantee enrollment cancellation. If a student enrolls in classes and then decides not to attend, it is still the student's responsibility to drop the classes to ensure the proper credit toward fees for the term, as defined by the current refund policy. Unpaid balances are subject to a \$50 late fee.

CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY

Once registered, students will be held responsible for all fees and grades assessed for those classes unless they take action to cancel their registration.

Registration does not automatically carry with it the right of refund or reduction of indebtedness in cases of failure or inability to attend class or in cases of withdrawal. The student assumes the risk of all changes in business or personal affairs.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

Wayne College reserves the right to cancel a course when the registration is not sufficient to warrant its continuance, to divide a class if enrollment is too large and to change instructors when necessary.

WITHDRAWAL

To withdraw, a student must complete a formal withdrawal in the Student Services Office. "F" grades will be assigned for work discontinued without official withdrawal. **Nonattendance does not constitute official withdrawal.**

WASH PERIOD

A wash period is when a student would be permitted to drop a class and add a class (after the 100% refund period) during the same term or session and not be assessed the prorated amount for the class that was dropped. The class added must be of equal or greater value than the class dropped. The University of Akron will allow a class wash during the refund period only. A class must be added after the session/term start date, and the drop must occur during the refund period of that class for a wash.

EFFECT OF SCHEDULE CHANGES/ WITHDRAWAL ON FINANCIAL AID AWARD

If your tuition bill is paid using financial aid and you withdraw from some of your courses your aid could be affected.

When you withdraw from all classes prior to completing 60 percent of the period/semester for which federal aid was provided, the following refund policy will apply. Federal law specifies the amount of federal student aid that must be returned (refunded) to the appropriate aid programs.

You earn federal aid on a prorated basis and are not considered to have earned 100 percent of your aid until you attend past the 60 percent point of the period/semester.

The earned financial aid percentage is determined by dividing the days attended in the period by the total days in the period. For example, a student withdraws on the 5th day of a semester that has 110 days in its period – $5/110 = 5$ percent earned. Subtracting earned aid from aid that was awarded and disbursed gives you the amount of unearned aid that must be returned. The student is billed for any account balance when the College is required to return funds.

Once the student has attended past the 60 percent point of the period, all financial aid is considered earned, although successful completion of coursework is required to maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Withdrawal date. Withdrawal occurs the date the withdrawal form is processed by the Registration Office, the date the student is officially dismissed from the College or the last date of participation in an academic-related event. In the case of unofficial withdrawals, it is the midpoint of the period of enrollment or date the student last attended class or other academic-related event (e.g. exams).

If you have any question about how this regulation may affect you, please contact the Student Accounts and Financial Aid Office before withdrawing from classes or discontinuing class attendance.
